# Required Immunization: 7th and 12th Grade

The Meningococcal vaccine requirement was put into place during the start of the 2017 school year by the Iowa Department of Public Health. This requires that all students entering 7th and 12th grade have a Meningococcal vaccine booster before school starts this fall.

Meningococcal disease is a life threatening illness that is caused by bacteria that infects the brain, blood, and spinal cord. It easily spreads in crowded settings. The vaccine will be required prior to both the 7th and 12th grades.

All students entering 7th & 12th grade must have proof of having the Meningococcal vaccine before school starts in August, unless the student has a Certificate of Immunization Exemption.

There will be no grace/extension period for the implementation of this requirement

## An Additional Required Immunization for 7th graders:

The Tdap requirement has been put in place since the 2013/14 school year and requires a booster dose of Tetanus, Diphtheria, and acellular Pertussis containing vaccine for students entering 7th grade, regardless of the interval since the last Tetanus/Diphtheria containing vaccine. Pertussis (whopping cough) is a very contagious disease that causes violent coughing fits that make it hard to breathe.

All students entering 7th grade must have proof of having both the Meningococcal and the Tdap vaccines before school starts in August, unless the student has a Certificate of Immunization Exemption.

There will be no grace/extension period for the implementation of this requirement.

Now is a great time for your child to receive these immunization requirements and beat the back-to-school rush by making an appointment for your incoming 7th and 12th grader.



# School Board Meeting

The Board shall meet on the third Monday of each month to consider items of business and matters other than policies pertaining to the school system. All meetings shall be held in the board room unless otherwise voted by the board. Meetings may be changed to other dates because of conflicts.

Procedure For Addressing the Board

If a citizen has a question about the operation of the schools, he/she is encouraged to contact the teacher, principal and Superintendent in line of progression. Experience has shown that this is the best procedure to follow for the most satisfactory results.

While it is not the Board's intent to stifle public participation in its meetings, it is apparent that if the Board is going to complete its agenda within a reasonable time, and more importantly, in a businesslike manner, it will be necessary to implement more formal operational procedures for the meeting.

Perhaps we need to remind ourselves this is the meeting of the Board - not the district. Board business is the main purpose of this meeting. Therefore, to keep the meeting moving in an orderly fashion, the following procedure will be instituted:

- 1. A citizen wishing to have an item considered for inclusion on the agenda should request same of the Superintendent or Board President no later than 5 school days prior to a regular meeting of the Board.
  - A citizen wishing to make a brief statement to express a viewpoint, or ask a question regarding an item on the agenda, should secure permission from the Board President prior to the meeting. There will be a 3 minute time limit per person, per subject. This policy shall not prohibit the Board President from extending or shortening the time limit.
  - 3. When called upon, the person wishing to address the chair, shall stand, address the Board stating their name, and then, their concern or question.
  - 4. The Board, in conducting its business in an orderly manner, can best proceed without undue interruptions or other interference. The presiding officer has the right and obligation to terminate prolonged or irrelevant speeches or discussion.
  - 5. If it appears there is much interest in one particular agenda item, the chair may call for a special meeting to discuss that one item. The Board meeting will then proceed to an orderly fashion to accomplish the business for that session.

#### Grievances

Whenever a citizen is aggrieved at the action of any employee, such citizen may give information to the employee's immediate supervisor. In the event that the matter is not satisfactorily resolved, the appeal process will follow this order:

- 1. Other supervisory or administrators in the line of responsibility
- 2. The Superintendent of Schools
- 3. The Board of Directors

The Board of Directors shall strongly encourage that this chain of appeal be followed.
